Expect this volume to continue to increase as service develops. In addition to improved patient access, this upgraded MRI is also a good tool for recruiting physicians, especially orthopedic. Installation of the air handling in the OR is complete. These controls will improve control of humidity and temperature in the OR. In addition to improved patient care, this is also advantageous in recruiting surgeons. The Covid numbers are still going down.
