Bill Ermann, CEO of Memorial Hospital of Texas County joined the meeting.

Ermann reported that Covid numbers are still going down. They met with the Auxiliary President, Barbara Campbell last week to discuss reopening of the gift shop. They have been doing a lot of cleaning and maintenance on the gift shop in case they do open. They will have an Auxiliary meeting Tuesday June 8th to further discuss it. Also, per the CDC guidelines there will be no more pre-surgical Covid testing for asymptomatic patients who have been fully vaccinated. Adam Fick is now the full-time pharmacist. Midland Financial Services are the Medicaid enrollment specialist group and are going to be performing on-site education for patient and the financial billing team. We completed on-site HER demonstrations last week; current HER vendor does not meet facility needs so exploring vendors Meditech and Cerner; both vendors offer a webbased system; decision will be made over the next 30 days following team survey, discussing and financial analysis.

The Hospital Authority is requesting \$9,995 to replace the fan in the imaging department air handling system. The current fan is inoperable and requires replacement to provide air flow in the department waiting and exam area. We received two quotes: one was \$12,000.00 and the other was \$10,000.00, we are selecting the lower quote from Air Pro.
